

FACT SHEET

The mission of the University of Minnesota Retirees Association (UMRA) is to support the interests of U of M retirees and provide opportunities to learn, serve, and connect. UMRA seeks to benefit members, the University, and the community through an array of informational, social, travel, volunteer, and support activities. Membership is open to all retirees from all five campuses in the U of M System, their spouses and partners. Incorporated in 1978, UMRA has served, supported, and advocated for the interests of the University for more than 40 years.

By the numbers

- **Nearly 800.** The number of UMRA members as of June 2022. Includes faculty, staff, spouses, partners, and friends.
- **8 x 2.** Excellent programming has been a hallmark of UMRA since its inception. During the COVID-19 pandemic, UMRA continued its monthly forums and workshops via Zoom and attendance was consistently high. From September 2022 to May 2023, the program schedule includes 8 forums and 8 workshops, to be held in-person and via Zoom.
- \$34 million. The total contributed by UMRA members to the U's "Driven" campaign.
- **20,000+.** The estimated number of volunteer hours contributed in service to the University by UMRA members annually (pre-COVID).
- **50,000+.** The estimated number of volunteer hours contributed in service to the community at large by UMRA members annually (pre-COVID).
- \$5,000. Grants of up to \$5,000 each are available to University retirees through UMRA's competitive Professional Development Grants for Retirees program.
- **8.** The number of newsletters UMRA publishes annually (September–May) and distributes by mail, email, and online at umra.umn.edu/newsletters.
- **2022.** The year UMRA and the University Retirees Volunteer Center reconnected as a single organization to broaden and expand service opportunities for U of M retirees.
