What do I do with all my pictures?

1. Make prints





2. Make cards







3. Make photo books of your favorite pictures, family vacations, travels, family history, etc.

A book of family photos every year or two would give, over time, an archive that could be held in the hand and paged through by many generations.

4. Make a journal/commentary illustrated with your own photos.

It is a nice way to use your photos and to give reasons why they are important to you. Putting your pictures into a word processing document is also an alternative way of making a photo book.

5. Make a refrigerator magnet

6. Take pictures to document your household possessions

A set of pictures on a flash drive in a safe deposit box or stored in the cloud could help in the worst sorts of situations, e.g., fire or major burglary. Some people might want to combine these pictures with a short description of some or all items - where they came from, how much they cost if purchased, etc. For very expensive items once might want to include copies of documents as evidence of purchase price, appraisal, provenance, etc.

7. Use your pictures in an end of the year holiday card.



7. Make a calendar

Many companies offer the ability to make a calendar. Upload your pictures, choose the type of calendar you want and then choose the pictures you want for each month. To find a company do a web search on "photo calendars."



8. Use a digital frame for a digital slideshow

Digital frames are widely available. Many have an internal memory that allow you to load pictures for your slide show. However, most of these internal memories have limited capacity. You can usually use a flash drive or a photo memory card for greater memory and a slideshow with more pictures. Check your frame to see what sorts of external memory devices it will accept. Some frames have WiFi and will display pictures you have stored on the webi.



9 Use a web service to create one or more share sites or share on social media
