The 2021-22 program year was the third affected by the COVID pandemic. All our programs were virtual Zoom webinars until we returned for an in-person luncheon in May. We started with producing three webinars per month: a Forum, a Living Well Workshop and an extra forum called UMRA A.M. After the fall, we stopped doing the UMRA A.M. programs because the workload was too burdensome for our production volunteers.

The production team, an ad hoc group of volunteers dealt with all the logistical and technical aspects of making our virtual programs happen, including scheduling, scripting, , monitoring and trouble shooting. The team included producer Kris Mortensen, technical directors Virgil Larson and John Anderson, and question moderator Mary Koppel.

In preparation for our return to in-person events, we appointed a Hosting Team to take care of registering attendees, working with the venue and welcoming attendees. This group was chaired by Diane Young, and included Diane Gihl, Char Greenwald, and Nancy Helmich.

For our in-person May meeting, we experimented with a hybrid production, with a live Zoom broadcast of our meeting. After hiring a consultant and doing the hybrid meeting, we determined that continuing to do so was not feasible given our present circumstances. Our venue, the Campus Club West Wing, is not well-equipped for live broadcasts; the equipment needed was cumbersome and obtrusive, and our Zoom attendance was low, too low to justify the expense.

The plan for the 2022-23 program year is to do six monthly luncheon forums in person, with no live streaming, but likely recording for post-hoc viewing. In January and February, we will have no luncheons, and our forums will be virtual, because of the difficulty of winter travel. Our eight workshops will be solely virtual. We recognize that a number of members cannot make in-person presentations and prefer virtual ones, while others find the camaraderie of in-person meetings invaluable. Thus we are offering programs for both groups.

We were pleased with how the year went and believe that our programs provided diverse and topical content, offered by some excellent and knowledgeable speakers, including a special extra program with MN Governor Walz. Our programs were as follows:
