Using the Libraries: Retiree Privileges

University of Minnesota employees who left the University with retirement eligibility retain their full employee library privileges:

- borrowing print materials
- remote access to electronic resources
- interlibrary loan



Using the Libraries: Retiree Privileges

To be eligible to have full access to the Libraries, University, faculty and staff members must:

- be age 50 to 54 with 15 years of service, or
- be age 55 or older with five years of service, or
- have 30 years of service regardless of age

You will have access to the library resources at the campus where you worked.

Using the Libraries: Retiree Privileges



Retiree privileges should seamlessly continue after your retirement, though this depends on your department promptly processing your retirement paperwork. If you are a retired employee and do not have library privileges, please contact your department first.

Using the Libraries: Without Retiree Privileges

Friends of the Libraries -\$80 (or \$40 for members of the UMN Alumni Association)

- Print material borrowing
- Invitations to lectures, exhibit openings, author readings, and other special events at the University Libraries.
- Discounts at the University of Minnesota Bookstores located in Coffman Memorial Union.
- Subscriptions to publications for Friends and supporters of the Libraries.


Using the Libraries: Without Retiree Privileges

General Public Access

- Most library spaces are open to public during all business hours.
- Access to print materials for use in the libraries, including special collections and archives.
- Access to most electronic resources are available on-site, on library computer workstations.

All Minnesota residents have access to select electronic resources via eLibrary Minnesota. Don't forget about your public library too!


