The mission of the University of Minnesota Retirees Association (UMRA) is to support the interests of U of M retirees and provide opportunities to learn, serve, and connect. UMRA seeks to benefit members, the University, and the community through an array of informational, social, travel, volunteer, and support activities. Membership is open to all retirees from all five campuses in the U of M System and their partners. Incorporated in 1978, UMRA has served, supported, and advocated for the interests of the University for 45 years.

By the numbers

- **Nearly 800.** The number of UMRA members as of July 2023. Includes faculty, staff, partners, and friends.
- **8 x 2.** Excellent programming has been a hallmark of UMRA since its inception. From September 2023 to May 2024, the program schedule includes 8 forums and 8 workshops, to be held in-person or via Zoom.
- **\$34 million.** The total contributed by UMRA members to the U's "Driven" campaign.
- **\$5,000.** Grants of up to \$5,000 each are available to University retirees through UMRA's competitive Professional Development Grants for Retirees program.
- 4 + 8. The number of print + electronic newsletters UMRA publishes annually (September–May) and distributes by mail, email, and online at umra.umn.edu/newsletters.
- **2022.** The year UMRA and the University Retirees Volunteer Center reconnected as a single organization to broaden and expand service opportunities for U of M retirees.
- **Thousands.** The number of hours our volunteers contribute each year in service to the University and the community.
