Volunteer eligibility and training requirements: Everyone is welcome to sign up as a volunteer. Volunteers will go through a brief training upon arrival to their shift.

What to wear: Volunteers should dress in business casual, preferably black clothing.

Parking/Transportation: Volunteers will receive free parking. The 21^{st} Ave S and 19^{th} Ave Parking Ramp are the closest parking ramps. Volunteers should bring their parking ticket from the University ramp to the house manager upon arrival. Further instructions will be given when volunteers register for their shift(s).
